YEAR 12

Y12 UCAS AND CAREERS

Today (Wednesday) Y12 students had an assembly outlining their UCAS journey. It is this time of year that we explain to Y12s the various Post RR6 options with an outline of the UCAS timeline for all applications. Please do discuss at home potential courses and universities and statement writing. Early entry students (any course at the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, or for courses in medicine, veterinary medicine/science, and dentistry) should be having discussions with Ms Green (UCAS and careers coordinator) in relation to entry requirements and courses etc. Early entries should be researching and shortlisting courses, colleges and universities now.

We support and strongly advise visits to universities; it is a huge motivator. We also strongly encourage students to start thinking of what will make their application statement stand out. It is not just about excellent grades. Universities like to see students that are active in furthering themselves. Self-starters, partaking in online webinars or virtual work experience opportunities that are widely available will give an advantage. We urge students to sign up to these opportunities now in Y12. Community action, volunteering, leadership, wider reading, visiting lectures, taking part in organisations such as the NCS and DofE both now and over the summer, signing up to organisations that offer support like the Sutton Trust etc. will very much help in all applications and interviews.

All students need to take ownership of their future plans- we advise that they make an appointment with our UCAS and careers coordinator to help them plan.

Next term we will have a UCAS and careers parents/careers information evening and look forward to seeing you there.
