WHOLE SCHOOL	WORLD BOOK DAY Rutlish will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday with a literary quiz in tutor time and a tag hunt throughout the day. Every student will receive a £1 book token from the World Book Day organisation.
	If you can do so at any point during the day please join us to Drop Everything And Read for 10 minutes, to celebrate the benefits and pleasures of literacy. Please ensure your child brings a reading book for the day – they should always have one in their bag and should be visiting the LRC regularly to try out different books.
	This year the WBD theme is 'You are a reader', encouraging students to notice reading wherever they are – environmental as well as academic - and the benefits of this. You can help your child to notice the different kinds of reading around them, and the benefits of developing their own literacy.
	We will be running a Tag hunt, with a selection of flags hidden around the school for which students will collect the answers to submit to Mrs O'Brien in the LRC by the end of the day on Friday. They just need to write their full names and form on their sheet to be entered into a draw for all correct entries - £10 book token for the winner.
	The new Twisted Tales writing competition has been announced on Fronter Literacy – students should collect an entry form from me in EN5 or from the LRC. We had huge success in the last competition, with a number of our students' entries to be published in the forthcoming Young Writers collection.
	We have a new KS3 Reading Club on Thursdays after school – sign up in the LRC - and shortly will be starting our Breakfast Reading Club. Teachers will nominate students for this, and for Ms Reynolds' 'Reading for Confidence' group.
	Students may have noticed our ongoing restocking of the LRC, with new books arriving all the time and new displays by our librarian, Mrs O'Brien. Use of the LRC has been restricted this week due to interviews for the Junior Leadership Team, but will be fully in action again on Friday.
