## "BLACK AND GREAT: THE ESSENTIAL WORKPLACE TOOLKIT"

On Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> May, a group of year 10 students and staff, including Ms Howarth, attended a talk organised by Ursuline High School's Afro-Caribbean society. The society had invited students from Rutlish School, Ricards Lodge, Raynes Park, Wimbledon College, Coombe Girls and St Marks Academy to hear Rene Germain, author of "Black and Great" share her experiences of the challenges the black community face in the workplace. Germain spoke of stereotyping, imposter syndrome and intersectionality as a black woman in the workplace, and gave her top tips for building a personal brand. She then took questions from the audience about some of her biggest challenges and what she had learnt from those she interviewed for her book.

Rutlish students listened intently, asked engaging questions and then received a free copy of Germain's new book. "Black and Great" provides a guide for Black students ready to make their mark in the working world and beyond, giving honest and practical advice on carving their career whilst embracing their ethnicity. The book shares the career journeys of over 20 successful Black British professionals and entrepreneurs from TV & film, sport, media, law, medicine and finance through open letters and interviews, providing advice, support and encouragement to Black students and professionals starting out in their working lives. The book reveals the highs and lows, how they bounced back from failure, plus the best and worst advice they have received over the years. It was a privilege to hear Rene Germain speak with such humility, humour and integrity, and has left our students and staff feeling inspired and equipped to navigate some of the challenges faced in the workplace.
