

Summer School Report September 2021



Rutlish School conducted Summer School from Monday 9th August 2021 to Friday 13th August 2021. Our Summer School was designed following the [Summer schools guidance - GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](https://www.gov.uk/guidance/summer-schools).

What we offered?

Rutlish School ran a Transition Summer School programme designed to support students with preparing for secondary school. Our programme sought to introduce students to skills needed at KS3 in a variety of curriculum subjects, as well as offering enrichment activities and workshops that focused on resilience and relationship building to support with the transition from primary to secondary school. The following programmes were in place:

What?	Description
Introduction to KS3 curriculum	Areas of KS3 curriculum developed skills in literacy, numeracy, humanities, sciences and technology. Sessions were delivered by Rutlish School staff to support students to establish relationships with staff before beginning in September.
Emotional Wellbeing	BigFoot Arts Education (a theatre in education company) delivered three workshops to each group of students working on skills needed to support the transition into secondary school. The workshops developed emotional resilience and relationships skills, as well as mental health and wellbeing strategies to manage anxiety around transition.
Enrichment	Sessions on orienteering skills, teamwork, communication and building relationships.

Attendance to Summer School

All 240 incoming Y7 students were offered a place on our Summer School. Places were awarded to all students who wished to attend on the basis that they would commit to all 5 days of our programme.

External Providers (Bigfoot Arts Education)	Delivered three workshops to build skills needed for successful transition and delivered one performance to whole summer school about overcoming challenge during move from primary to secondary school.	£1,080
Resources	Materials ordered to support delivery of the summer school curriculum and enrichment sessions eg. science equipment, practical arts and crafts materials, and printing for orienteering sessions.	£1,315.85
