#### Work experience in schools leads to salary uplift in workplace

Students who complete a work experience placement while at school earn higher salaries once they enter the workforce, according to research by Speakers for Schools. Not only did 31% of young people say that work experience improved their confidence, it also has an impact on soft skills such as communication and problem-solving.

## 86% of younger generation prioritise company culture in job search

Company culture is a top priority for 18 to 34 year olds when looking for a job, a new study has revealed. It also found that 81% said they would not apply for a job if it had unrealistic expectations – followed by no salary listed and non-specific descriptions of the role.










#### **Employers Views on Skills**

CIPD has published its Employers Views on Skills Policy in the UK. Highlights include:


• Employers who recruited a young person direct from, school, college or university were asked to rate how prepared they were for work. The image below shows that 16 – 18 year old school leavers were the least prepared for the workplace.





 The most common reasons employers felt young people were not prepared for work included poor attitude or lack of motivation, a lack of employability skills and common sense.

- The report stressed that supporting and encouraging employers to provide placement opportunities for young people is vital. There is currently a real barrier and too few employers engage with FE institutions.
- Employers are facing a major skills challenge and noted that technical and job-specific skills are the most difficult to find when recruiting. This is followed by essential skills such as problem-solving, planning, organisation and communication.









## Mental health worries dominate 2022 youth voice census

The youth voice census of over 4,000 11 to 30 year olds reports that anxiety and mental health were some of the biggest barriers when thinking about work and finding a job.

Around 45% of young people said the quality of their careers education was 'average' and 25% said it was 'poor' or 'very poor'.

A Women Count 2022 report claims that having more women in exec roles could boost the economy by £58bn, because of a lack of gender diversity within leadership teams.










#### The decline in youth apprenticeships in England

A look at the decline in youth apprenticeships. The image below shows those aged under 19 went from 120,000 apprenticeship starts in 2014/15 to just over 65,000 in 2020/21.

Recommendations to improve things include the need to enforce regulations on training, wages and funding. It was also suggested that employers should be incentivised to offer apprenticeships to young school-leavers.
