Dates: 28th November – 15th December

Mocks will go ahead as normal and is a great chance for us to assess where the students are currently.

Key points to keep in mind:

- Mocks are really important and should be treated like final exams as it counts as these may impact on college/sixth form applications, and also as evidence if we ever have to re-assess how we assess.
- Attendance up until the mocks is vital as your son needs to be in every lesson.

Buying Procedure

- 1) You will be sent a list of these and how to purchase them.

How can you support your child?

- You are the expert on your son and what works for one child will not work for another
- Creating the environment
- Do they work well with timetables? The least they should have is a list of topics that they should be studying at a set time
- Ensuring he attends intervention sessions
- Contact the school immediately if you have any concerns
- Correct equipment



How can you support your child on the day of the exam?

- Running late: **ring the school**
- Student ill: **ring the school** a special consideration could be submitted but frequently requires a doctors certificate
- Damaged hand can't write: **ring the school** and send him in
- Nervous and can't cope: **ring the school** and still get him in alternatives can be arranged



The Day of the Exam

- Up and early and on time
- Correct equipment.
- **No mobile phone**
- Ensure he leaves early enough to attends revision session for morning exam (from 8:00)
- Black pens
- Start times 9.00am and 1.30pm
- If your son feels ill during an exam, he must inform an invigilator
