Specialist SEND support in every school and community



The government has set out a schools white paper, [Every child achieving and thriving](#), which includes a £4 billion investment to make every school inclusive and transform outcomes for SEND children.

Highlights include:

Major SEND reforms

- £1.6 billion Inclusive Mainstream Fund for small-group interventions, early support, and resources for children with additional needs.
- £1.8 billion "Experts at Hand" service, creating local pools of specialists such as educational psychologists and therapists to support schools.
- Schools must publish a new Inclusion Strategy, replacing the current SEN Information Report, explaining how provision is planned and delivered.
- Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) will be reserved for the most complex cases; all other pupils with additional needs will have legally-required Individual Support Plans (ISPs) describing their everyday provision.

Secondary school visions

- On average, children will leave school achieving a grade 5 or higher across their GCSEs.
- Children from low-income backgrounds will achieve around a full grade higher in each of their GCSEs than is the case today. This equates to over 1.3 million grade improvements across the cohort, and over 30,000 more disadvantaged children passing English and maths at grade 4 or above each year.

Teacher workforce development

- A delivery plan to recruit 6,500 more teachers.

- The government will target shortage subjects, support areas that face recruitment challenges, and tackle retention issues across secondary and special schools and FE colleges.
- Investment in a new teacher retention programme from Autumn 2026.

Armed forces careers unlocked for tens of thousands through new recruitment drive

The agreement between the Ministry of Defence and Department for Work and Pensions will open up opportunities for tens of thousands of young people. Jobcentre staff will provide guidance on immediate opportunities, with roles ranging from engineering and cyber, to healthcare and logistics.

UK unemployment hits highest rate for nearly five years



The unemployment rate in the UK has reached its highest rate in nearly five years, according to the Office for National Statistics (ONS). Young people are suffering the most, with unemployment for those aged between 16 and 24 rising to 16.1%, its highest in more than 10 years.

The retail and wholesale sector saw the biggest fall in the number of workers on company payrolls, with 65,000 jobs lost in the sector since January last year. Health and social work saw the biggest rise in payrolled workers of any sector, adding 39,000 jobs in the year to January.

Young people are set to benefit from TV and film industry support for the Government's Youth Guarantee scheme. There remains a skills gap in the sector. By supporting young people into work, the sector will help close that gap and ensure the UK maintains its position as a world leading hub for film and television production.

Pinewood Studios is the latest Youth Guarantee Supporter. Pinewood Group, incorporating Pinewood and Shepperton Studios in the UK, has been introducing youth training through its 'Behind the Screen' programme. Delivered with Jobcentre Plus, the scheme supports people currently out of work by offering paid six-month placements that provide hands-on experience and a first step into the film and TV industry.

Government modernises exam records with new app



Year 11 students across England will be able to view their GCSE results on their phones for the first time from this summer, speeding up the process of enrolling into college, and freeing up teachers and college staff from unnecessary paperwork.

The Education Record app is being rolled out nationally to modernise how young people access their exam results once they have left school.

Pupils will still go into school on results day to meet face-to-face with their teachers and receive their results. Their results will later become available on the app.

BBC set to launch AI Unpacked Week in March




The BBC is producing a week of programmes in March about artificial intelligence (AI), following new research about the impact it is having on the way we live, work and learn.

School building programme to create 13,000 apprenticeships



During National Apprenticeship Week the government announced 13,000 apprenticeship and T Level opportunities in construction through the government's plan to transform school and college buildings. Construction firms working on school and college buildings must show that they recruit apprentices and 90% of these opportunities must be offered within a 30-mile radius of the building.

Colleges can also now bid for a share of almost £300 million in capital funding to create more places in colleges across the country, in addition to over £280 million devolved to local mayors and leaders. The funding will create more places for 16-19 year olds and also expand construction training provision, helping to reduce waiting lists, address skills shortages, and support wider economic growth.

Legal age to become a train driver reduced



The government has announced it is lowering the legal age to become a train driver from 20 to 18 years old from 30 June 2026. Rail Minister Lord Hendo said: "This change will open doors for those wanting to move straight into the workplace, giving a younger generation the chance to build rewarding careers in the railway, whether that's in freight or passenger services."

Currently, less than 4% of train drivers are aged under 30 years old and only 11% are female. Less than 13% of train drivers are from a minority ethnic background.

Teenagers are favouring trades over traditional careers



Housebuilder Barratt Redrow carried out a survey of over one thousand 13 - 19 year olds and almost half (48%) stated that they would prefer to earn a living from a skilled trade than an office-based management job. Around one fifth of teenagers (22%) were interested in pursuing an office-based management role, whilst more than half of respondents (62%) would prefer to master a hands-on skill and 51% indicated that climbing the corporate ladder was "not for them."

Diversifying new industries needs 'coordinated career support'



The report called for the creation of a Frontier Innovation Pathways and Talent Map, which would visualise gaps and coverage in support, and target cold spots.

Council unveils new, state-of-the-art leisure centre



Sunday for Sammy Trust receives match funding pledge to strengthen arts careers



New East Sussex College apprenticeship tackles roofing skills shortage

A major new roofing apprenticeship programme will launch for the first time in East Sussex in September 2026, creating new routes into skilled employment while helping address a growing industry-wide skills shortage.

The National Federation of Roofing Contractors (NFRC) has reported that more than half of roofing businesses nationally are experiencing recruitment difficulties, with 65% saying skills shortages are already limiting the amount of work they can take on.

Exmoor National Park paid traineeships for young people



Exmoor National Park Authority (ENPA) is offering paid traineeships to 18 to 25-year-olds. Current roles on offer include a woodland trainee based in Simonsbath and an engagement trainee working with ENPA.

Exmoor Pioneers programme co-ordinator Philippa Hill said: "Exmoor has a growing skills gap in certain roles, critical to caring for the landscape, while at the same time young people are struggling to land jobs in their chosen careers."
