Battle of the Bands

Some of these students were also interviewed by Radio 4. The evening showcased high quality music from Rutlish, Ricards, JAGS, Hampton School and Wimbledon High. Maths Challenge

Congratulations to all students who entered the UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge. In March, 67 students from Years 9, 10 and 11 took part in the challenge. Over half the students received certificates, with seven students achieving Gold, putting them in the top 5% of entrants nationally, 12 received Silver certificates, putting them in the in the top 15% and a further 15 received Bronze certificates (top 40%).

All the Gold students have qualified for the next round (the Pink or Grey Kangaroo). A special mention goes to Toby Brett who was in the top 600 entrants in his year and has qualified for the Hamilton Olympiad. Well done to all who took part. Names of all certificate holders are below:

11 students were selected to be ball boys for this year's Wimbledon Championship. It is a shame they will now not be able to have this experience as the championship has been cancelled this year.


